HOLIDAY TAKE & MAKE CRAFTS AVAILABLE



The Library will also be closed on December 31 and New Year's Day. We will reopen on Saturday January 2 for our regular hours.







NEW GRAPHIC NOVEL SERIES: PHOEBE AND HER UNICORN

Phoebe and Her Unicorn is the best selling graphic novel series by Dana Simpson first published in 2014. Originally a web comic, Phoebe and Her Unicorn, chronicles the adventures of nine year old Phoebe and her magical BFF as they encounter childhood challenges and issues.

This highly reviewed series has received numerous awards and in June 2020, it was announced that *Phoebe and Her Unicorn* will be adapted into an animated series set to debut on Nickelodeon.

The Westville-ND Public Library now has four titles available: Phoebe and Her Unicorn, Unicorn on a Roll, Unicorn Crossing, and Unicorn of Many Hats.





NEW NONFICTION: BARACK OBAMA: THE PROMISED LAND

In this highly anticipated first volume of presidential memoirs, Barack Obama tells about his journey from political aspirations to the night of November 4, 2008 when he was elected as the 44th President of the United States, becoming the first African-American to hold the nation's highest office.

A New York Times and Washington Post Notable Book, *The Promised Land* is a beautifully written and compelling story that Jennifer Szalai of the New York Times describes as a "book to the 'next generation,' to young people who seek to 'remake the world,' but the story he tells is less about unbridled possibility and more about the forces that inhibit it."

The book was released on November 17, 2020 and by November 24, had sold over 1.7 million copies in North America- breaking the record for first week sales of a presidential memoir.










WESTVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY RECEIVES INDIANA HUMANITIES GRANT



Earlier this year, Indiana Humanities awarded grants to Indiana libraries to fund collection development for advancing racial equity, thanks to the generosity of the Lilly Endowment. Schools, community organizations and libraries across Indiana were invited to apply to Indiana Humanities for funds to add digital or physical resources addressing systemic racism, inequitable policing and protest through a humanitarian lens. Indiana Humanities worked with the Indianapolis Public Library Collection Management Team to develop the list of eligible resources. Lilly Endowment provided Indiana Humanities with a grant to distribute \$134,264 to 150 nonprofit organizations in 60 Indiana counties to enable them to meet increased demand for materials to circulate in their communities. Local recipients include:
