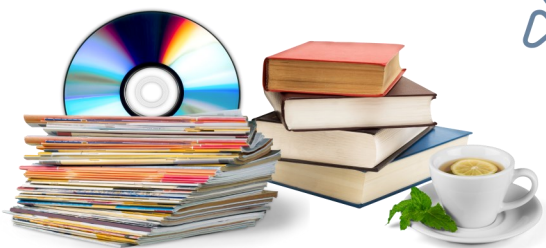
Ender's Game
